

(Ku. Tulsa R. Hande Vs. The State of Maharashtra & others.)

2. The applicant is challenging the transfer order dated 11.06.2026 on the ground that she has been repeatedly posted at check posts, which is against Clause 5 of Para-2 of G.R. dated 22.05.2017, which precludes repeated postings at check posts. The applicant is serving as a Forest Guard. She has placed on record two earlier orders showing that she had already served at Warwant Check Post and Dongaon Check Post. It is further submitted that the applicant has not yet been relieved.

3. In view of the above, **there shall be stay to the transfer till next date.**

4. Issue notice to respondents returnable **after four weeks.** Learned P.O. waives notice for State. Hamdast allowed.

5. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at this stage and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.

6. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on Respondents intimation / notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of O.A. Respondent is put to notice that the case would be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.

7. This intimation / notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1988, and the questions such as limitation and alternate remedy are kept open.

8. The service may be done by Hand delivery, speed post, courier and acknowledgement be obtained and produced along with affidavit of compliance in the Registry within one week. Applicant is directed to file Affidavit of compliance and notice.
